In order to be considered for freshman admission, we require students graduating from an unaccredited home school to demonstrate academic ability in each of the five core academic areas. English and Math ability will be assessed through performance on the SAT or ACT. Additionally, we require demonstration of ability through a standardized and comparative measure (i.e. a college course or standardized test) in: Foreign Language, Social Science and Lab Science (may be satisfied with ACT Science).

Please indicate how you will demonstrate your academic achievement via SAT subject tests, AP or IB test scores, or through College Coursework or a combination of these. Only one of these is required in each academic area. For example, a student may take a college course in Chemistry, a SAT subject test in French and an AP exam in World History.
