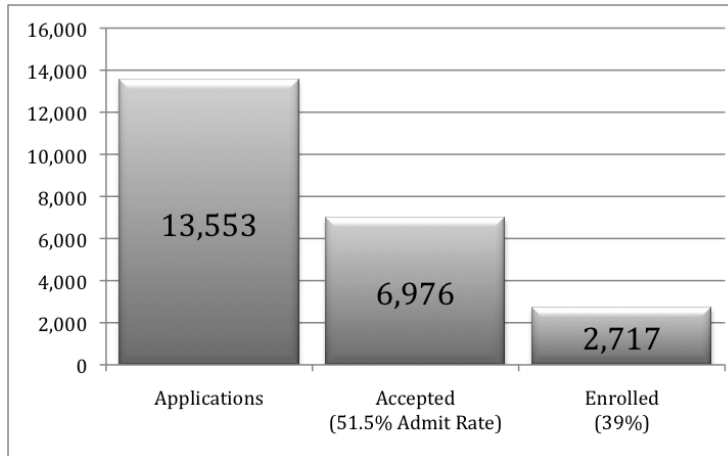

## AP/IB Credit

Georgia Tech accepts and awards course credit for Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate courses. Credit of AP courses is typically given with a score of 4 or 5 on the AP exam, and credit for IB courses is typically awarded with a score of a 5 or higher on the Higher Level IB exam. The President's Scholarship Program is given to approximately 60 outstanding entering freshmen who have demonstrated superb leadership skills, are among the top few in their class in academic performance, and show promise of continuing such performance in college and beyond.

## How to Apply

- To qualify as a candidate for the President's Scholarship, a student must simply:
  - Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident
  - Apply for admission to Georgia Tech as an entering first-time freshman by November 1
- SAT or ACT scores through the November test will be considered if Georgia Tech is designated as an immediate recipient of the scores.
- Students selected as semifinalists will receive a supplemental application that includes two teacher recommendation forms, and will be interviewed by regional committees.

### Accomplishments of Current PS Students:

- oThe average freshman PS entered with 19 hours of AP/IB credit, well over one semester.
- oAlmost 3/5 of the President's Scholars have studied abroad.
- oPresident's Scholars include:
  - Recent winners of the Goldwater, Fulbright, and Astronaut Scholarships
  - A winner of the GT InVenture prize, given to the best invention among Tech students
  - The starting center on the varsity football team
- oThe retention rate for President's Scholars entering 2005-2008 is 98%.

### Accomplishments of PS Graduates:

- President's Scholars have continued their educations at the top graduate schools in the United States, and many have won fellowships—Rhodes, Marshall, Truman, and National Science Foundation awards—to help pay for their costs.
- Many PSs have been hired by top companies, including NASA, Disney, Coca-Cola, Apple, Microsoft, Google, etc.
- Over 1,400 President's Scholars have graduated from Georgia Tech over the 28 years of the program.
- Over 86 percent have graduated with honors. For those graduating after 2006, 80% graduated with highest honors.
